

What is ICEFISHX?

The Intelligence Communications Enterprise for Information Sharing and Exchange (ICEFISHX) was developed in partnership by federal, state and local governments as well as private industry. ICEFISHX is a method of collecting information about suspicious activity for real-time evaluation and analysis by the FBI.

ICEFISHX allows for two-way communication between its members. The purpose is to identify potential patterns of terrorist or criminal operations in Minnesota, South Dakota and North Dakota and quickly get that information to those who need it most.

The FBI Field Intelligence Group (FIG) and the Minnesota Joint Analysis Center (MNJAC) operate ICEFISHX. Together they produce and disseminate information bulletins and public education materials. These materials are made available on the ICEFISHX Web site.

What is the Minnesota Joint Analysis Center (MNJAC)?

MNJAC collects, manages, and distributes strategic information relating to terrorist operations and criminal activity. MNJAC also develops products and training programs. These programs focus on counterterrorism and other criminal activities in Minnesota.

MNJAC serves as an information conduit for



federal, state and local governments as well as private industry. MNJAC disseminates critical information to the appropriate agency through ICEFISHX.

What is the FBI Field Intelligence Group (FIG)?

FIG is the intelligence component of the FBI Minneapolis Field Office. FIG manages, executes, and coordinates intelligence functions. FIG focuses on counterterrorism, counterintelligence and general criminal matters.

Homeland Security Advisories

FIG and MNJAC collect, evaluate, and analyze reports of suspicious activities. This analysis helps identify patterns of terrorist and criminal operations. FIG and MNJAC produce a summary of the analysis and regularly post advisories on the ICEFISHX Web site. Advisories include

background information on events, suggested protective measures, criminal and terrorist trends, and analysis of threats to Minnesota.

Reporting Suspicious Activity

Reports of suspicious activity are taken seriously and may be forwarded to FIG.

Members can use ICEFISHX to submit suspicious activity reports. Suspicious activity could include; false documents, surveillance of critical infrastructure, money laundering, forged identification or stolen equipment.

Resource Library

The ICEFISHX Resource Library is available only to subscribers. The library includes information about homeland security grants, public education, suggested security measures, threat analysis and previous MNJAC advisories.

Requests for Information

ICEFISHX subscribers can request specific information about potential terrorism threats, criminal activities, special events, training materials or threat assessments. Information is shared on a need-to-know basis — sharing sensitive information may be prohibited by federal and state law.
